- Shipping from international locations

What illegal sellers actually deliver:

1. Nothing at all after payment is processed
2. Fake tracking numbers with no actual shipment
3. Counterfeit pills containing fentanyl or other lethal substances
4. Expired medication that has degraded
5. Completely different drugs than what was ordered

If you encounter a website offering Dilaudid without a prescription or with no visit ever claims, reporting it helps protect others.
